

Blackwelder Award for Outstanding Greek Leadership Scholarship

Eligibility: This award is intended to give financial assistance to a student who has demonstrated leadership and/or campus involvement in the Greek community. The goal of this award is to reward students who are making a difference in the lives of others with their time and talents. The recipient must be a member of a current Iowa State University Greek Fraternity or Sorority and demonstrate a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. The recipient must demonstrate campus and community involvement determined by the awarding authority. Preference shall be given to applicants who demonstrate financial need.
